I, Maren, have an opportunity I would like to share with you and, if you are willing, have you participate with me on a mission of community discovery. As you may know, I am a member of the Charlottesville Clergy Collective, which is made-up of 17 local inter-faith congregations. The CCC was formed after the church shooting in Charleston in 2015 to "establish, develop and promote racial leadership" and to "engage in group events to highlight issues of racial and social justice in our community." I would like to invite you to participate in a process that looks at the role of religion in the history of racism in Charlottesville. To that end, the CCC is hosting a catered dinner at the **Carver Center**, **Thursday, January 31 at 6 p.m**., inviting up to 10 members of each participating faith community to gather for dinner and discussion:

1. Become better acquainted across racial lines.

2. Explain the work of the CCC.

3. Begin conversation about shared histories of Cville faith communities around racism, and look at resources. Looking ahead to the rest of the "O God!" journey: Second gathering this spring- 2 or 3 congregations share more deeply about their histories; Third gathering - Interfaith service in August – where do we go from here, present-day issues. There will be discomfort and uncertainty, but I believe it may bring us into a new understanding of the summary of the law, to love God and our neighbors as ourselves. This is not a guilt trip—but an invitation to expand our capacity to be with the history of racial separation in churches and in our own lives.
